## **Your Lockport Public Library...An Open Door Update**

### **Library receives federal stimulus funds through the New York State Library.**

The New York State Library, a unit of the Office of Cultural Education within the New York State Education Department (NYSED) has been awarded 9.5 million in a grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) to expand computer access in public libraries across New York State. The funding is being provided through the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP).

The Lockport Public Library has been awarded a grant to participate in the two-year project as one of 30 public libraries that will facilitate workforce training. High unemployment rates, a distressed economy, and a lack of affordable public access to high-speed broadband services, education, training, and technical support have been particularly acute in geographically isolated upstate communities. The grant will enable the State library and its public library partners to purchase equipment, partner with other workforce trainers in the community, and provide access to training and resources. This grant cannot be used for existing operational expenses.

New York State Education Commissioner David Steiner commented, "Libraries are vital to our communities and our economy. The increased broadband capacity, training and online resources funded through this grant will provide New Yorkers with access to essential online information for work, healthcare, education and citizenship as well as electronic government resources."

"What librarians and libraries do every day is vitally important work...This grant will enable our libraries to continue to do critically important work and to expand the opportunities, education, and services that high speed Internet provides to the un-served and underserved in our communities", notes State Librarian Bernard Margolis. " The Public Computing Centers, funded and supported under the Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP), are designed to bring the fruits of high speed connectivity to everyone. Many parts of New York State will for the first time be able to experience the bounty of communications and content available on-line. The Public Computing Centers are a primary outpost for free public access to a wide array of broadband services. As part of a highly effective network, the PCCs and the libraries of which they are a part, will continue their critical role as a hub for community life and service."

More information on project details will be forthcoming as the library moves into the implementation process.
