In 2024, the Friends conducted two gigantic book sales. Back to normal after the pandemic. The funds were used to support programs at the library throughout the year.





A Message from the Director

2024 began as a busy year. We picked up where 2023 left off. Programming was in full swing and we continue to maintain the library for future generations.

Once the slate roof project was completed, the focus turned to the interior of the original library, especially the Wheeler Room and the Sawyer Room. It was evident that there was moisture damage to the walls. Plaster was falling off the wall and we were losing the beautiful decorative border. The next project was to have a company come in and remove any damaged plaster. The original library building was shutdown for two months while work was done. Several areas were taken right back to the wire mesh under the plaster. A section of the border that was still intact was removed to act as a mold. New borders were cast and inserted where needed. The area was painstakingly put back together. It would be difficult to see where the repairs were made. Once the dust had settled, painters came in and gave the area a much needed fresh coat of paint. Our beautiful artwork was rehung on the walls and the rooms were ready for a new chapter.

During this time some smaller upgrades took place. Local History received a fresh coat of paint. Something that it had not had in more than two decades. The Orchard Room in the Children's Department and the Floor 1 elevator lobby received new carpeting. More upgrades are scheduled for 2025. Stay tuned!
